
Chateau de' Pique **Brings New Flavor to Seymour**

A restored barn on the property serves as a reception area with a tasting room that can seat up to 126 people. The upstairs of the barn area offers a chapel which can be used for small wedding ceremonies and offers a gorgeous view of the countryside. Also on the nearly 80 acres, located at 6361 North County Road 760 East, is a large tent which can seat nearly 400 people for wedding receptions, parties, and gatherings. The tasting room, which offers free wine tasting, is open daily and now offers 7 types of wines,
